Dear Ms. Sheldon,

SeaShare is so thankful for your generous support in 2017. You helped us bring more seafood to more hungry people in Washington. The [REDACTED] contribution we received from the Tulalip Tribes provided 32,000 servings of seafood. We estimate that this fed 10,000 individuals.

Because of the generosity of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions and others, SeaShare was able to donate a total of 302,265 pounds of seafood in Washington last year, which is the equivalent of over 1.2 million servings of seafood to those in our community who need it most. With an average pack size of three pounds for a family of four, SeaShare was able to serve over 403,000 people in Washington last year.

Our donations in Washington went to Food Lifeline's 275 member food banks, food pantries, and feeding centers in Western Washington; to the Millionair Club's hot meals program in Seattle; the Union Gospel Mission's meal program in Seattle, Helpline House on Bainbridge Island, and to Second Harvest in Spokane, which serves 250 food banks, food pantries, and feeding centers east of the Cascades. Seafood donations included canned wild Alaskan salmon, frozen wild Alaskan salmon steaks, frozen wild Alaskan halibut steaks, frozen Alaskan pollock, frozen Tilapia, canned tuna, frozen Pacific Cod, and frozen shrimp.

We continued to work closely with the community of fishermen in Alaska and Washington to provide the highest quality first-run seafood products to the food banks we serve. We are happy to report that in 2017 we were able to improve access to nutritious seafood for our neighbors struggling with food insecurity, so that they can better learn, work, and contribute to the community.

Thank you for all that you do to support nonprofits in our region. I look forward to submitting a new grant proposal in June.
