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Thanks to the generous donation of the Tulalip Tribes, the Seattle Indian Center has been able to supply the following services:

We were able to provide bus tickets to clients looking for work, attending medical appointments and seeking other resources. We were able to distribute food to over 250 families for thanksgiving that included whole chickens or whole turkeys based on the preference of the family. We can buy staples for the Food Bank such as eggs that are given away on a bi-weekly basis. Our Food Bank serves an average of 1,300 families every month.

The Community Meal Program was supported by buying much needed supplies such as utensils, plates, cups, napkins and cleaning supplies. Our Community Meal Program serves an average of 2500 individuals per month.

We were able to provide shelter to men, women and families. We provided emergency housing to homeless families, so they could get out of the freezing temperatures. Our hostel for single men gives single working men a place to stay, regroup, shower and rest. Our newest addition, Tillie's Safe House, is for young men, women and youth regardless of gender. This program serves victims of human trafficking that are trying to escape victimization.

Through the SIC Day Center we have new computers for clients to access other resources as well as look for and apply for work online. We provide hygiene supplies, socks, coffee/tea and snacks. We were able to purchase new antigravity chairs for clients to rest on during the day.

Across the SIC we were able to get essential supplies to support all our programs. We greatly thank the Tulalip Tribes for making all this possible.
