The high cost of moving staff to fully remote services as well as necessary PPE supplies was not only unprecedented but unbudgeted. The invaluable support that the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions provided to the community was gratefully received. Your charitable giving brought much-needed relief and supplies to our staff and those we serve.



Your dollars meant 828 children and adults with disabilities in our community, and their families received essential services last year. Individuals who relied on innovative services remained engaged and supported throughout the pandemic because of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions.



Because your funding allowed us to offset the cost of COVID supports, Aliya worked alongside her mom and her speech-language pathologist, Hannah, utilizing secure telehealth accounts. Aliya reached a breakthrough moment in her speech development and is acquiring new words each day. Also, because of your investment, individuals like Pablo received continued employment support. Pablo learned how to wear his facemask correctly and safely carry out his duties at his new job at KFC. Pablo prepares trays of biscuits, sanitizes tables, chairs, counters, and door handles. He sweeps and mops the lobby and bathrooms. He even makes sure the parking lot stays clean, takes the trash out, and recycles the cardboard. Pablo has greater confidence and economic opportunity because of his new job and you.
