During 2023, Skagit Fisheries Kids in Creeks Program reached 187 students at 6 schools within the Skagit River Watershed. The students had classroom visits which introduced and reinforced salmon habitat requirements and habitat restoration concepts. Most students completed service-learning projects including riparian tree planting, potting young trees, and mulching trees recently planted at restoration sites.

In addition to Skagit Fisheries staff, we had two Washington Service Corps members two student interns, and six community volunteers who worked to implement the classroom visits and well as the service-learning field trips.

According to the results of the pre and post program surveys, 91% of students showed an increase of knowledge of program topics. Of those, 57% increased their scores by 3 or more.

We did not reach our anticipated numbers due to some teachers retiring and needing more time to develop relationships with their replacements; some teachers opting to do different programs, or wait until next school year. We already have schools lined up to participate in Fall 2024
