Tulalip Tribes Year End Report Q3 2014 14.2.

Last year Sojourner Place received a grant towards the Life Skills program to help single homeless women move successfully towards self-sufficiency. This funding from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions was utilized to offer life skills classes including responsible renter, practical skills, job readiness, and money management. These life skills classes help women become self-sufficient and to build stability. Sojourner's programs focus on continuous, structured support and training to help women make long-term life changes.

In late 2014, Jubilee Women's Center acquired Sojourner Place, a transitional housing facility for 10 women in the University District. Since its founding in 1983, Jubilee has helped transform the lives of hundreds of women by ending the cycle of poverty and homelessness. Together both organizations fill a critical role in the continuum of care for women experiencing poverty who are in need of time, a safe environment, supportive services, and learning opportunities to transition into sustainable, independent living.
