Dear Marilyn and all at Tulalip Tribes,

Thank you again for your grant of [REDACTED] in support of the immediate needs of older adults in our area. Below is a report on the impact of your generosity. Please let me know if you have any questions or would like any additional information.

Last year Sound Generations served over 25,000 older adults, adults with disabilities, and family caregivers. Over a third were elders of color, nearly half reported having a disability, and 3 in 4 had low incomes. Our website, which has more details on our programs and services, is www.soundgenerations.org

Last year we provided nearly 250 gift cards to help address older adults' immediate needs, for a total value of \$33,950. The older adults with low incomes who received these gift cards used them to purchase medications, incontinence supplies, food, warm clothes, cleaning products, walkers and other medical equipment, fans and/or heaters to manage extreme weather, and more. Here are a couple of specific examples:

- One older gentleman had a health issue that required hospitalization and a leave from work. Unfortunately, his recovery took longer than expected, which impacted his income and prevented him from paying for the medication prescribed by his doctor. Sound Generations provided a gift card that he used to pay for his prescription medication, enabling him to complete his recovery and return to work – both factors contributing to his continued independence and self-sufficiency!
- Another client was almost out of food at home and had neither a way to get to the store, nor money to buy groceries. Sound Generations provided a gift card for groceries and connected him to free, on-demand transportation.
- Finally, a client who was receiving services from both our Geriatric Regional Assessment Team and our Meals on Wheels program reached out for help when their microwave was dying. The microwave was essential to heating their delivered meals, and our Pathways Information & Assistance program was able to provide him with a gift card that allowed him to purchase a new

microwave, so that he could continue to heat delivered meals and maintain his nutrition, health, and independence.

We generally do not take pictures of clients in these circumstances, but we do have some general recent images of clients participating in programs, events, and activities through Sound Generations. See below and thank you again for all your support!
