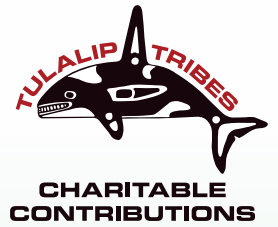

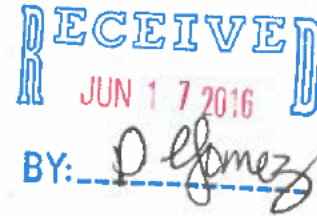

Dear Tulalip Tribes,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continuing support of the South Kitsap School Districts Indian Education Program. The \$█████ grant you awarded our program in 2015 helped to provide tutoring assistance twice a week to our elementary, junior high and high school students during the 2015-2016 school year.

Your grant, combined with a grant we also received from the Quinault Indian Nation, enabled us to provide four months of tutoring assistance in math, language arts and reading, in small groups, to our Native American students enrolled in the Indian Education Program. Your grant allowed us to provide 159 hours of tutoring assistance to our students.

We are very proud of the accomplishments of our Native American students. Here at South Kitsap, 70% of our Native American students graduated in the 2014-2015 school year. We had 20% of the seniors from the 2014-2015 school year that did not graduate return this school year to continue working toward their graduation. In addition, our Native American students outscored the non-Native population in the 2015 spring MSP and HSPE state tests in several grade levels and areas:

- 5th grade math
- 8th grade reading and math

With limited Federal funding, we would not be able to continue to offer the same level of support to our Native American students without the grant awards from the tribes we've been so fortunate to receive. The additional support we are able to provide is instrumental in the success of our Native American students. Please accept this celebration of partnership gift on behalf of the South Kitsap School District, the Indian Education Program and our Native American families. We offer a heartfelt thank you for your continuing support to our students and their education.
