Over the past year, SPSC has witnessed an increase in vulnerability and need among the immigrant senior community we serve - your investment has been so important in ensuring concerns are addressed, needs are met, and seniors are served with dignity during our current challenging times.

The award received from the Tulalip Tribes helped to cover essential staffing, outreach, and program activities as we responded to urgent needs within our community. Over this past year, SPSC provided the following services and resources, all free of charge, to our senior community:

- 9,312 nutritious culturally-relevant meals
- 3,867 social service contacts
- 156 fitness classes
- 139 enrichment activities
- 1,564 Lyft rides ensuring access to medical care and food resources
- 7 cultural celebrations

Reportable Outcomes and Outputs:

As a result of the grant from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions, SPSC seniors from underserved communities experienced the following improved outcomes:

- relief from hunger
- consistent nutrition and improved physical health
- improved mental health - relief from the fear of not having consistent reliable food access
- indirect financial assistance from free meals and programs
- social connection among seniors who speak their language/represent their cultures
- improved socio-economic outcomes (such as housing and job security) as a result of personalized social services support
- new friendships made among diverse seniors
- referrals to food banks and other resources
- joy at their cultures represented in delicious meals and social events
