Introduction


Wrightslaw is a catalyst for education reform that provides information about special education law, education law and advocacy for children with disabilities. Due to a generous grant from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund, SSP2P offered the workshop for the first time in history to citizens of Thurston County and the surrounding areas.

Participants

44 parents and professionals gathered from Thurston County and the surrounding areas to attend the one full day workshop.

Outcomes

Attendees learned:



- How to take an active role in managing their child's special education Gained knowledge from key sections in the IDEA of 2004, what children's test scores mean, and how to develop smart IEPs
- How to prepare for meetings, the gentle art of disagreeing, and how to maintain healthy working relationships with the school
