SEEDArts is pleased to report that with funding from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions, we successfully presented the **2018 Arts Gumbo: Celebrate Dia De Los Muertos** event on October 18 and 20, 2018.

On Thursday, October 18, guests engaged in a Book Chat at the Columbia branch of the Seattle Public Library to discuss *Brownsville: Stories*, by Oscar Casares. The discussion was led by Francisca Garcia. On Saturday October 20, at 1pm at the Rainier Arts Center, a screening of "Flor Silverstre" was presented by the Consulado de Mexico en Seattle. In the evening, our presenting partners, Bailladores de Bronce and Joyas Mestizas, entertained and educated our audiences with traditional Mexican folk dances. After the performances, guests were treated to tacos, a Mexican art display, a Dia De Los Muertos offrenda, sugar skull painting, face painting and piñatas.

Our team did a fantastic job of bringing the local Mexican Latino population to the events. About 80% of the people in attendance were of Mexican Latino descent with children being about 30% of attendees, many of whom took advantage of free tickets made available. Total attendance was 160 with an additional 36 performers.

We hope you will enjoy the images provided taken at Arts Gumbo. Thank you for your and the Tulalip tribe's support of our programming.
