TULALIP TRIBE CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS REPORT

In Quarter 2, 2025, the Tulalip Tribe Charitable Contributions approved a \$[REDACTED] grant to provide a 1:1 match for new donations made during TACID's fundraising event and luncheon. All grant funds and donations raised during the "Home of Hope and Belonging" Fundraising Luncheon were used to support TACID's Wellness and Recovery Program and operating expenses in 2025-2026.

TACID's "Home of Hope and Belonging" Fundraiser was held on October 22, 2025. Over donors, funders, and community partners well attended the 1-hour event. During the program, the Tulalip Tribe was thanked for their \$[REDACTED] matching grant. In addition to the luncheon, TACID hosted its first Silent Auction and sold raffle tickets. The \$[REDACTED] grant was matched 1:1, contributing \$[REDACTED], or approximately [REDACTED] % of the \$42,004 raised by the event.

TACID Wellness and Recovery Program 2025

2025 Highlights and Achievements:

- TACID served 1,304 unduplicated individuals and provided 16, 522 services.
- Increased participation and diversity in the drop-in Dayroom, including more participants with intellectual and developmental disabilities and behavioral health challenges.
- Increased participation in twice-weekly Bingo games by young adults who are transitioning from child to adult services; 50-60 participants a week getting the opportunity to grow friendships and community.
- Additional and enhanced services and Individual Peer Support with CPCs for disabled participants who are experiencing secondary behavioral health challenges such as depression and anxiety.
- Quarterly Talent Shows hosted by CPCs for participants' self- expression and the opportunity to support each other and celebrate their abilities.

New Peer Support Groups and increased wellness activities based on community needs and participant feedback:

- Artful Expressions: a participatory art making group.
- Chronically Strong Peer Group: for adults living with chronic pain & ongoing health conditions.
- Rainbow Resilience Peer Group: for adults who identify as LGBTQ+ and are living with a disability or mental health challenge.
- The Reading Club: for participants to share their love of reading and to spark meaningful conversations.
- Intuitive Painting sessions increased from biweekly to weekly.

Benefit to the Community:

TACID benefits the Pierce County community by offering very low barrier services for adults with disabilities and mental/behavioral health challenges. TACID's free services promote health equity by filling a gap in access to support for low income, uninsured and under-insured adults, and their families. In September, participants were asked to complete TACID's Quality-of-Life Survey (QOL) to measure the program's qualitative success and benefit to participants. The survey consists of eight social and emotional indicators of quality of life. TACID collected 45 surveys from participants who come to TACID 3+ days a week.

TACID QOL Survey 2025 Results

Participating at TACID helps me to—

1. understand myself better: 95%.
2. improve my relationships: 86%.
3. learn things that help me in daily life: 90%.
4. find ways to solve problems: 93%.
5. take more responsibility for my life: 93%.
6. pursue my dreams: 90%.

7. make friends and socialize more often: 100%.
8. feel like a valuable member of the TACID community: 100%.

Participant Quotes from 2025 Quality of Life Survey:

“This place has given me PURPOSE... FRIENDS... AN ACTIVE LIFE... SAVED MY LIFE.”

“I can feel how much the staff care for everyone that walks in the door. TACID is my safe space now.”
