#### Dear Marilyn,

It is with great pleasure that I submit to you the final report for Tacoma Rescue Mission's grant award from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions.

#### **Program Description**

The award from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions was used to fund the continued operating costs of our family shelter.

Located at a publicly undisclosed address within the City of Tacoma, our family shelter provides emergency shelter, food, and supplies to families experiencing homelessness and families who are fleeing domestic violence. It is operated as a clean and sober campus, with urinalyses and background checks completed for all guests. Families stay together in private rooms and are given access to case management, career and skills training, and our youth program. The youth program helps to enroll children in school, provides on-site preschool, and offers after-school and summer programming activities — all with the goal to support the social and emotional health of youth in our care to break the ongoing cycle of homelessness and abuse.

#### **Outcome Results**

During our 2022 fiscal year, funds from the Tulalip Tribes have helped us achieve the following:

511 children and guardians served34,463 bed nights provided253,925 meals served across our shelters

#### Impact

The most important results of this grant and our continued work in the community cannot just be measured in numbers. It is told in the stories of our guests, like Fleurdelis and her son, Drake.



Fleurdelis and Drake moved to Washington State to live with family and get back on their feet. Unfortunately, they weren't able to live with them as planned, and ended up sleeping in their car or staying in motels when they could afford it. One night, their car was broken in to as they slept, and all of Fleurdelis's important documents were stolen.

Thankfully, Fleurdelis learned about Tacoma Rescue Mission. She and her son arrived to the safety of our family shelter. While Fleurdelis worked, Drake participated in our youth program. "While Drake is in the program, I have more time to do what I need to do...It's less overwhelming to know he was somewhere positive to go while I'm at work," Fleurdelis explains.

We were able to help Fleurdelis obtain her documents. Recently, she and Drake moved into their own place, and Drake is thriving!
