On behalf of TeenTix's staff, Board of Directors, and the thousands of young people that we serve, thank you so much for your contribution in 2019. With your partnership, we are able to make sure that teens can connect to artistic experiences – experiences that nurture critical thinking, leadership and collaboration, and a greater sense of self.

TeenTix's mission is to build a bright future for our city by empowering young people to take an active role in shaping their arts community as audience members, critics, influencers, advocates, patrons, and leaders. Your contribution of made in 2019 supported our Pass Program, helping young people gain affordable access to art and participate in their communities.

Across all of our programs, we were able to connect with \$10,705 teens in 2019. Some of program highlights include:



- On average, 250 teens signed up for a TeenTix Pass each week.
- TeenTix launched the digital pass, making it easy to access their pass on their phones at Arts and Community Partner events.
- 268 teens participated Press Corps workshops, intensives, and the TeenTix Newsroom.
- We had more Arts Partners host pop-up workshops for the Press Corps than ever before.
 Partners included: Tacoma Arts Museum, Arts West, Seattle Opera, and Pacific Music Works
- The New Guard: Arts Leadership Society became a paid program for teens, where participants receive a stipend for their roles as leaders and decision-makers.

I also think the art community needs teen leaders because art is about expression, and like adults, teens have a lot of that! I think its a great way for us teens to express our emotions and learn about ourselves and others. Art is for everyone, and everyone should be able to be an arts leader. For me personally finding creative writing has helped to find myself and express how I am feeling".

"My favorite part was being given the opportunity to think critically in a way not usually explored in a classroom. I found myself more immersed in mediums I have sat through but never experienced."
