Dear Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund Members,

The Kingston Coffee Oasis is OPEN for youth and the community! It was a three year dream in the making. Thank you so much for making this long journey with us. We didn't anticipate it would take as long as it did but it has allowed us to build connections in the community and we now have with a committed group of community volunteers.



This year while we were waiting for the final occupancy permit our Kingston team participated in community events like the Fourth of July parade and outreach teams went out to the schools to build relationships with youth. Above is Chase, Angela, and Brennan at the Kingston Grand Opening who represented the Youth Advisory Council. It was a joyful celebration of a safe, beautiful, hope-filled space for the youth of Kingston.

October 29, 2019 we opened the café to the public and created a safe place for youth and case management session with its own entrance while we are completing the finishing touches of the downstairs youth drop-in center.



Since opening we have had:

- 14 youth contacted in Outreach
- 17 youth enter the Drop-In Center
- 4 youth engage in Case Management
- 1 youth build protective factors of Safety
- 2 youth build protective factors of Well-Being
- 1 youth build protective factors of Self-Sufficiency
- 1 youth entered safe housing in Coffee Oasis Host Homes program
- 1 youth completed 6 weeks of Job Preparation Classes
- 1 youth are currently in a Job Training Internship in the community
- 1 youth acquired employment (Burger King in Poulsbo)

The Kitsap Regional Library has been a strong supporter of our youth programs and has hosted job training internships at their libraries throughout Kitsap County. The Kingston Library and Village Green invited us to hold our Job Preparation Classes in a room in the library, while our downstairs in being finished. Our first graduate is now at Lucky Star consignment in Kingston, our first local business internship site!

We are excited to begin this new year in Kingston. We will be focusing on building strong roots in the community and building trusting relationships with the hurting and homeless youth of Kingston. The downstairs will be fully functional with shower and laundry capacity by February 2020. We project reaching over 150 Kingston youth through our continuum of services. Thank you for making this project possible for youth, such as C. who recently told us *“Thank you guys so much. I really appreciate it. I do sometimes still feel drained and wonder if I’ll have strength to make it through the day without feeling the need to tap out, but lately I feel like it’s getting a bit easier to get through days feeling like I barely made it or that it took all my strength to just show up and keep going.”*
