Final report to the Tulalip Tribe Charitable Fund

The Tulalip grant was to The Evergreen State College Enduring Legacies Native Cases Initiative . The project objectives were 1) to develop culturally relevant curriculum in the form of Native Cases, 2) to offer professional development so educators could develop expertise in writing and applying the case method of teaching, 3) to write four new cases on climate change and Indian Child Welfare and 4) to widely disseminate the products of this project. Our Native Cases are now widely used by more than 150 colleges in the US and reach hundreds of educators and thousands of students. The project began in 2005.

The original Tulalip proposal was for [REDACTED] and was funded for [REDACTED]. We offered a two day professional development workshop at The Evergreen State College Longhouse on July 13-14, 2024 and developed several new cases. The workshop Agenda is attached along with several photos. Linda Moon Stumpff (San Carlos Apache) and Barbara Leigh Smith led the conference. Forty educators participated in the conference. The audience included several K-12 tribal professional development leaders. Highlights of the conference were the two keynotes by Shana Brown who spoke about implementation of the State Since Time Immemorial Curriculum in Seattle and David Trout, (Nisqually, who spoke on climate change. Several new cases were used on climate change and the Oppenheimer movie. Evaluations indicated that the participants were very enthusiastic about using cases in the future.
