We thank you for your generous contribution to The NOAH Center and our mission during the 2024 grant cycle.

The crisis of abandoned, unwanted dogs and cats has grown. We have been getting calls from desperate rescues, looking for help finding homes for these animals. The NOAH Center continues to have a solution with programs to save more lives. These programs and the funding granted is critical to fulfilling our mission. The support and partnership we receive from you is vital to the work we are doing in the community. We sincerely appreciate your continued support of our mission and organization.

- Our high-volume clinic, which was created to offer low cost spay/neuter, vaccination and microchipping services to low-income families who are unable to afford private practice veterinary services, is now GROWING – we opened our new clinic on June 3, 2025!
- The adoption center continues to provide relief to partnering shelters by transferring in adoptable animals who would otherwise be euthanized for space.
- Our foster department has almost doubled the amount of community members served with our Mom's Last Litter program.

General Performance indicators:

January through December of 2024 - we have surpassed all of last year's numbers!

- Transferred & saved the lives of 3928 dogs & cats from overcrowded shelters!
- Performed over 9972 surgeries for pets of low income families – including 1220 for the Mom's Last Litter program!
- Provided 3,927 Family Friendly adoptions to community members!
- Our Foster program had 2604 animals come through our program. Not only that, but because of donations such as yours, we were able to save 1266 more orphaned kittens and puppies! Incredible!
- Provided volunteer opportunities for 479 active volunteers.

We serve the Puget Sound communities and provide our services at discounted prices that are affordable for our low-income community. As the economic struggle continues to impact more families, there is a greater need for our services. The funds you provided cover the difference in the cost for those surgeries, making it possible for us to continue serving the low-income community.
