On the second floor, The Sophia Way has opened <u>Helen's Place</u> and women are able to have safety and shelter 24/7/365. Helen's Place is the realization of a dream long held by The Sophia Way's late founder, Helen Leuzzi, as well many community partners on the Eastside. Thank you for your support and commitment for this project.



Even with the pandemic, construction remained on schedule and on August 19th there was a <u>ribbon</u> <u>cutting ceremony</u> (hosted virtually). Over that following weekend, women moved from the temporary shelter at the Red Lion hotel in Bellevue. As reflected below, the women were over joyed to see the new space with raised beds and individual pods for sleeping.





Helen's Place is offering women the care and comfort they need, while being supported in navigating their individual journey to stability and housing.

- 24/7 day center and emergency shelter
- 9,500 sq. ft. of space
- 48 single sleeping beds
- Shower and laundry facilities
- Nutritious meals
