Our sincere thanks go out to the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions committee. Your grant of awarded in March 2017, was used to provide key outpatient case management services to our clients through our Puget Sound Networks (PSN) program. Each year, we serve 180-220 of King County's most vulnerable residents, and PSN is our biggest program.

Over the course of the past year, Transitional Resources has continued to produce outstanding outcomes while serving

some of our community's most vulnerable residents, individuals who are living with serious and persistent mental illness. We are also happy to report that we have many exciting opportunities ahead.

- Our clients had a 95%+ success rate in remaining safely housed. The men and women we serve typically come to us from homelessness, and with the skyrocketing cost of housing in our area, this is a major victory.
- Additionally, over 94% of our outpatient clients remained out of the hospital and jails, which is a big improvement for these clients who have often cycled in and out of institutions prior to coming to TR.



• We are making strides in combatting co-occurring substance use disorders that many of our clients experience. We are seeing big improvements thanks to the addition of a peer counselor with lived experience who has helped our clients learn new strategies to reduce use and prevent relapse. And one of our clients has even started a new chapter of Narcotics Anonymous with the support of the agency, and it is open to the community at large.



•In addition, we are working toward integrated healthcare. With behavioral and primary care providers working together, we hope to see the healthcare disparities that our clients face begin to close, so they can live longer, healthier lives.

•Finally, we are beginning an exciting project to acquire and redevelop several properties that we have been renting for many years. Our redevelopment will result in many more housing units for clients. By owning more properties, TR will be better positioned to continue providing housing close to the agency. This is critical with the cost of rentals in our area continuing to grow at unprecedented rates.
