Your support made it possible for us to welcome an unprecedented number of Indigenous communities and performers in honor of this year's theme, "Love Knows No Borders."

As is customary, the commemoration began with an opening prayer and a rally in Westlake Park in downtown Seattle, followed by a march to City Hall led by our own Daybreak Star Preschool.

At our community celebration at Daybreak Star later in the day, we honored legendary activist Feanette BlackBear and community leader Sili Savusa of the White Center Community Development Association. After serving a free salmon dinner to all, we also welcomed Indigenous performers from a broad range of backgrounds and regions: hoop dancer Ryan Yellowjohn (Shoshone Bannock), P'urhepecha (Northwestern Mexico), Seattle Youth Siasi Tonga Houeiki (Tonga), and Los Rebeldes de la Cueca (Chile). We were also honored to be joined by the Tulalip Youth Council. It was so uplifting to see and hear the youth from Tulalip singing and drumming so loud and proud!

This diverse array of performers brought in larger than ever crowds, with attendance estimated at 550-600. Attached are photos of the events your support helped make possible. Thank you very much for your continuing commitment to honor and raise up our region's Native peoples.
