On behalf of University Beyond Bars (UBB), I would like to thank the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions for its continued support of our organization, and for the grant (Q2 2019 14.2) in support of UBB's mission to provide access to higher education to prisoners at the Monroe Correctional Complex in Monroe, Washington. This report is to certify that the Tulalip Tribes' award of award of that the Tulalip disbursed towards our program and student body.

In one typical quarter, UBB enrolls roughly 300 students in 16 courses—70% are first-time college students, nearly half are people of color, and the majority will be released in 5 years or less. With the support of the Tulalip Tribes, in 2019, we graduated 14 students with their associate degrees and 1 student with his bachelor's. Currently, we have approximately 70 students working toward their associate degrees, and 30 students active/eligible for their bachelor's degrees.

With your support, UBB is able to continue changing the culture of prison by using higher education to transform the lives of students, their families, and ultimately our communities, both inside and outside the prison. Below is a quote from one of our 2019 graduates:
