- Kristen Cunningham '20 graduated just last week from Puget Sound with a degree in Exercise Science. She plans to become a physical therapist or athletic trainer and is currently working as a fitness trainer in Bonney Lake, Washington.

Last year's recipient, McKenzie Baldwin '22, is a rising junior from Bellingham, Washington. She is pursuing a degree in art history and plans to obtain a master's degree in museum studies after graduation.
