Wow! What an event. This was our most successful fundraiser ever.

In 2018, we were honoring a very special islander who made a very special gift to the community; Bill Fisher and his gift of a pond and 90 acres of forest with a trail.

\$149,000 was raised the night of the event for Land Trust projects across Vashon-Maury Islands; including trails, nature preserves, and Matsuda Farm.

There were 270 guests in attendance and 21 of them were new to the Land Trust. A slideshow and video gave guests a taste for the diversity of projects the Land Trust manages. One of those guests introduced us to a foundation that awarded the Land Trust a \$20,000 grant at the end of 2018 for its restoration work along Judd Creek.

23 volunteers helped over the weekend to make the event run smoothly.
