Dear Marilyn and the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund Board,

Thanks in part to your generosity this year; we have many exciting things to report!

- 1) Record breaking attendance at KIDSTAGE-Currently over 450 students are attending or will attend summer camps at the new Second Stage and Youth Education Center. Up from 357 last year. Over 100 kids are in one of the summer productions *Anything Goes* or *Footloose*. 1,300 for the school year.
- 2) KIDSTAGE staff completed a full year in the Youth Program Quality Initiative program. The program is funded in part by the Raikes Foundation and administered by School's Out Washington. The program assesses program quality and provides training to staff and educators to meet their program quality goals. Village Theatre KIDSTAGE continued in its second year to achieve among the highest scores in the nation for youth engagement and program quality.
- 3) Free performances in the Wetmore Theater Plaza began Friday July 11th and run each week on Fridays at noon. Come and visit! Between 150 and 250 young people and their families attend.
- 4) Pied Piper provided two free Sensory-Friendly performances for 400 people with special needs.
- 5) Nearly 3,000 children received free in-school workshops prior to seeing a Pied Piper production with their class that brought literature to life on stage. 2,500 students received free tickets to Pied Piper shows.
- 7) We are providing program support for 32 youth from the Stillaguamish Tribes.

We are grateful for all that the Charitable Fund does to make our communities strong and healthy.
