With the help of Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund Vision has been able to provide recovery coaching, basic needs, and housing to people living with circumstances surrounding addiction.

About Us: Vision Church/Vision Hope Center is a 501 c3 organization that is on a mission to help others rebuild their lives and to reconnect families and communities that have been affected by substance abuse disorder, mental health disorder and domestic violence. Vision operates five WAQRR certified transitional living homes that provide a wide range of basic needs, social services, education and employment support, and recovery coaching. Vision serves meals to the community four days per week and operates a resource center that provides clothing, hygiene kits, food boxes and much more. to those in need. With a unique hands-on approach that includes empathy, accountability, mutual respect and serving others with loving mindset Vision is a place of Hope and Healing in the community

With a hands-on approach that is centered on each person. It is critical to understand that each person is unique and have different barriers and needs.

Vision Church/Vision Hope Center has five certified recovery coaches that work with residents within our housing program, as well as on a walk-in basis through the Vision Resource Center. Coaches assist clients with employment services, social services, court requirements and basic life skills. Many times, people who have been living with circumstances surrounding substance abuse disorder, mental health disorder, and domestic violence need to relearn basic and social skills. Within the recovery homes residents develop these skills within a community setting amongst peers who share similar struggles and barriers. Building connections within the homes provides a safe space to relearn the basic and social skills required to gain stability. Throughout Snohomish County we have seen a dramatic increase people who are homeless, living with substance abuse disorder, mental health disorder, and domestic violence.

With this grant Snohomish County Residents received one hundred food boxes filled with staples to assist them with stretching their food benefits and meals for an entire month. Additionally, one hundred hygiene kits have been given to people who were homeless and living with substance abuse disorder. Four persons have been assisted with one-on-one recovery coaching and housing needs to prevent from homelessness. Over the past year the need has significantly grown due to the pandemic's unforeseen effects on the community.

Vision ventures out to engage the community and to meet the needs of people throughout Snohomish County. Staff and volunteers regularly go out once per week to different areas of the county to pass out Covid-19 hygiene kits along with sack lunches. These kits have become critical in slowing the spread of the virus and keeping people who are homeless safe from being

infected with the Covid-19 virus. Going out over the weekend has proved to be helpful to the community as most organizations are not serving meals over the long weekend. We continue to serve our neighbors and meeting the needs of the people who are most vulnerable in our community.
