### Y Adventure School report:

Y Adventure School provides teens with an opportunity to learn in environments outside the classroom. Our curriculum focuses on leadership skills, environmental awareness, and team-building. However, our main goal is to promote social and emotional learning among the students in order to help them develop self-efficacy. They accomplish these goals through the outdoors and giving back to their community. The YAS program includes a variety of challenges to help students grow, which can take many forms.

So far this year, we have worked with students from Kulshan, Fairhaven and Blaine Middle Schools. We have volunteered to clean-up beaches at both Squalicum Beach and Point Whitehorn Marine Reserve. We have learned about outdoor ethics and how to identify native plants and animals while hiking in the Chuckanut Mountains. We learned how to set goals and manage our fears while rock climbing. We practiced verbal and non-verbal communication skills while doing team-building activities at the Y. And most importantly, we have learned about diversity and different perspectives when we've discussed and debriefed all of the aforementioned activities as a group. With YAS, students learn about themselves just as much as they learn about their peers and the environments they live in.
